

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#### **Physical Education**

The Schools on the Move Challenge is On. This is a month long program during February to encourage students, school staff and families to learn and practice the 5210+ healthy habits.

The goal is to get Everyday:

5 fruits and vegetables,

no more than 2 hours of recreational screen time,

1 hour or more of physical activity,

0 surgary drinks and

9 or more hours of sleep

**EVERY DAY!** 

**School challenge**-The top 15 small schools with highest percentage of participants will be awarded \$1500, \$1200, \$1000, \$750, \$500, \$250.

**Family Challenge**-Families who complete the blue family log and meet the 20 check Challenge have a chance to earn a \$50 King Soopers gift card (one card per school). The top five schools with the highest family participation will receive \$1000, \$750, \$500, \$250 to spend on PE equipment and school wellness initiatives.

For Grades 3-5, we will be discuss Nutrition Labels and how to determine if a drink is a "surgary drink." **The cutoff is 15 Grams of sugar (not carbohydrate) per serving**. Ask your student about Nutrition Labels and read one together.

**RiverSong Choir**: Choir continues to practice on Tuesday mornings from 7:30-8:00 a.m. in the music room. As a weather note, please make safety your priority. If we have school and there are no delays, we will have choir, but use your best judgment regarding attendance when there is inclement weather. If there is a delay or if school is cancelled, we would not have choir.

**Modern Band Club** was open to students in 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> grades, and the students who registered have received paperwork to complete and return. The club will begin on Thursday, February 6, after school, and will meet on Thursday afternoons until 3:45. It is important that students be picked up at the front of the school promptly at 3:45 on Thursdays when the club meets. The Modern Band Club will meet from February 6 until April 30, with a concert on April 23. There will be NO MODERN BAND on March 5, nor will we meet during Spring Break! Please mark your calendar if your student was accepted into the club.

The final Instrument Intensive—drums—will take place before school on Thursday, February 6, at 7:30. That is also the same day our after-school club starts!

Third, fourth, and fifth graders who wish to participate should arrive at the outside music room door between 7:25 and 7:30 a.m. on Thursday, February 6.



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Fifth Grade Showcase: CLPE 5<sup>th</sup> graders should begin thinking about whether they want to audition to perform a solo or small group act in the 5<sup>th</sup> grade program on May 7. Auditions will be held during music classes prior to Spring Break, from February 26-March 12. Acts must be school appropriate and music-related. # How Sick is Too Sick? When Children and Staff Should Stay Home from School or Child Care

There are three main reasons to keep sick children and adults at home:

- The child or staff member does not feel well enough to take part in usual activities. For example, a child is overly tired, fussy or will not stop crying.
- A child needs more care than teachers and staff can give while still caring for the other children.
- 3. The symptom or illness is on this list, and staying home is required.

Remember, the best ways to stop the spread of infection is through good hand washing and staying home when sick.

Symptoms	Child must stay home?
Diarrhea Frequent, loose, or watery stools (poop) compared to normal ones that are not caused by food or medicine.	Yes - if there are other symptoms along with the diarrhea (such as vomiting, fever, abdominal pain, jaundice, etc.), the diarrhea cannot be contained in the toilet, there is blood or mucous in the stool, the child is in diapers or the staff member handles food or bottles. Children and staff may return 24 hours after their last episode of diarrhea unless the diarrhea is caused by an illness that requires them to stay home longer.
Fever with behavior change or other illness. Babies who are 4 months or younger need to see a doctor right away for a fever of 100°F or higher.	A child should not be excluded if they have a fever with no other symptoms unless they are 4 months old or younger.  Yes - if there is also a rash, sore throat, throwing up, diarrhea, behavior changes, stiff neck, or difficulty breathing.
"Flu-Like" Symptoms Fever over 100°F with a cough or sore throat. Other flu symptoms can include tiredness, body aches, throwing up, and diarrhea.	Yes - for at least 24 hours after the fever is gone.  The fever needs to be gone, without using medicine that reduces the fever (acetaminophen or ibuprofen).
Coughing	Yes - if the ooughing is severe, uncontrolled, or the child has wheezing, rapid or trouble breathing. Medical attention is needed for wheezing, rapid or trouble breathing.  Note: Children with asthma may go to school with a written health care plan and the school is allowed to give them medicine and treatment.
Mild Respiratory or Cold Symptoms Stuffy nose with clear drainage, sneezing, and mild cough.	No - children and staff may go to school if they able to take part in usual activities. Children and staff should stay home if the symptoms are severe. This includes fever and if a child is not acting normally and/or has trouble breathing.
Vomiting/Throwing Up Throwing up two or more times in the past 24 hours, there are other symptoms in addition to the vomiting (such as fever, diarrhea, eto.).	Yes - until 24 hours after throwing up stops or a doctor says it is not contagious. If a child has a recent head injury, watch for other signs of illness and for dehydration. Adults who handle food and bottles must be excluded.

See second page for a list of illness that may require children or staff to stay home.



Illness	Child must stay home?
Chtcken Pox	Yes - until the blisters have dried and crusted (usually 6 days).
Conjunctivitis (pink eye)	No - children and adults do not need to stay home unless they
Pink color of eye and thick	have a fever or are not able to participate in usual activities.
yellow/green discharge	Call your dootor for advice and possible treatment.
Croup (see Coughing)	Call your doctor for advice. Note: Children and staff may be able to go to school unless they are not well enough to take part in usual activities.
Fifth's Disease	No - the illness is no longer contagious once the rash appears.
Hand Foot and Mouth Disease (Coxsackie virus)	No - unless the child or adult has mouth sores, is drooling and is not able to take part in usual activities.
Head Lice or Scables	Yes - children may stay at school or child care until the end of the day but cannot return until after they have had the first treatment.
Hepatitis A	Yes - until 1 week after the illness starts and when the child or staff is able to take part in normal activities.
	Children and staff should not go to another facility during the period of exclusion.
Herpes	No - unless there are open sores that cannot be covered or there is nonstop drooling.
Impetigo	Yes - children and adults needs to stay home until antibiotic treatment
	has started.
Ringworm	Yes - children may stay at school or child care until the end of the day but cannot return until after they have had the first treatment. Keep the area covered for the first 3 days if participating in sports with person to person contact.
Roseola	No - unless there is a fever or behavior changes.
RSV (Respiratory Synoytial	No - children and staff can go to school unless they are not well enough
Virus)	to take part in usual activities and/or they have trouble breathing. Call your doctor for advice.
Strep Throat	Yes - for 12 hours after starting antibiotics unless the doctor says that it is okay to return to school sconer. Children and staff also need to be able to take part in usual activities.
Vaccine Preventable Diseases Measles, Mumps, Rubella (German Measles), Pertussis (Whooping Cough)	Yes - Children and staff can return to school once the doctor says they are no longer contagious.
Yeast Infections Thrush or Candida diaper rash	No - follow good hand washing and hygiene practices.
Other Symptoms or illnesses not listed	Contact the child care center director or school health staff to see if the child or staff member needs to stay home.

Q: I have difficulty maintaining care for my child due to their unique needs. Would PSD preschool still be an option for our family?

A: If your family meets the selection criteria, the strong and unique supports available to your child will mirror those available to all kids in PSD. You will enjoy partnering with our skilled classroom teaching teams to meet your child's needs. We have strong family mental health supports.

Q: Sometimes, I'm not sure how to deal with my child's challenging behaviors. So far, we've not found a program that works for us. Would PSD be a good fit?

A: Yes, Our trained and compassionate professionals will collaborate with you and your child to develop the best educational plan possible.

Q: How skilled are the type of people who would work with my child?
