

Pirates,





PSD has developed their "Future Ready" program: www.PSDFutureReady.org to help students be ready to hit the ground running after graduation.

It may seem soon to start thinking about this in elementary school, but here are some highlights of what opportunities lie ahead for our students in Middle and High school:

 Starting in middle school, students will interact with xello- a program to help them determine their interests and strengths, and make academic choices based on that.

 $\,\circ\,$ The PSD Future's Lab (moving to Timnath HS soon) provides a space for High School students to gain experiential learning and earn professional certifications . There is transportation available from all schools to the lab.

 $\,\circ\,$ PSD partners with many local businesses to provide High School students with internships and mentorships

There are many opportunities for HS students to take college level courses and earn college credits including: College courses taught by HS teachers in the HS, free tuition and transportation to Front Range, the Ascent program where a student can qualify to be a 5th year senior at PSD, and attend Front Range that entire year for free.

Music Class Updates

We continue to experience music in various ways this year. We have been playing guitars, ukuleles, and keyboards quite a bit. We limit our singing to short periods of time, to avoid unnecessary risk



and/or quarantines. We will be exploring music from various cultures this spring, including music related to Black History Month in February and Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month in May.

Grade Level Program Performances

We are working on a plan to have each grade level perform a very short program (around 15 minutes or less) in our CLPE gym during April and May. We have reserved several dates and will communicate specific grade level dates and times shortly, but we intend to have two grade levels perform each of the evenings we have reserved. The three dates are April 7, April 21, and May 5. Of course, we will need to be flexible in case the COVID situation worsens.

Only fifth grade will present a longer program, as they will present a Showcase with a few combined songs and then solo or small group acts. I will discuss this with fifth graders in music class, and information will be sent home regarding auditions for solo and small group acts. All fifth graders will perform in the full group songs; auditioning to perform solo or in a small group is optional.

Clubs (RiverSong Choir and Modern Band)

Because we have been careful not to combine various grade levels, and because we need to limit the length of singing activities, we will not be having choir or modern band this year. We hope to resurrect these clubs fully in the 2022-23 school year.

Asynchronous Work

If your student is absent for any reason, but especially if the absence is an extended one, your student will be able to access most of the class activities online. Simply visit Mrs. Flail's Learning Page on the CLPE webpage, click the "Asynchronous Work" heading at the top of the main page, and then click the date for the week music class was missed. This will take you to a Google slide show which can be accessed by anyone signed in with their PSD account. For each slide, there are instructions in the "notes" section below the slide, and there are headings when an activity is targeted to a certain grade level. Of course, some activities cannot be completed outside of class, i.e., playing guitars, singing together, echoing the teacher, etc., but the bulk of the content will be accessible for students wishing to explore it.

Quaver Music Reminder

Our district has a special license and website for accessing student accounts through Quaver Music. These accounts are automatically created by our district technology team, and you do not need to create a username or password. Be sure to visit www.tinyurl.com/PSDQuaver and sign in using your student's PSD email and password. If you are asked to answer Yes or No, click No. Then you should be at the student dashboard, where your student can explore items like the "Creatives" and other activities.

PLEASE NOTE: DO NOT access Quaver through the Quaver website-it won't work with our special logins/accounts. Be aware that when you "Sign Out" from your Quaver account, you are often automatically sent to the main Quaver page, but that page will not work for your PSD login. You can click the tinyurl link above, or the Quaver button on the home page of Mrs. Flail's Learning Page. You can also bookmark the page when you are logged in! As mobile bus vaccine clinics are added or changes are made to existing clinics, they will be listed on the <u>COVID-19 Vaccines web page</u>. In case of a clinic cancelation, please refer to the <u>COVID-19 Vaccines web page</u>. Appointment registration links will also be listed as they become available.

Appointments are available on a first-come, first-serve basis to students, families and staff. Although appointments are encouraged, walk-ins are available. Flu shots will also be available at the clinics for free.

Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson and Johnson vaccines will all be available. Moderna and Johnson and Johnson are currently available for individuals who are 18 years or older. For those who get the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines: After receiving the first dose, a second-dose appointment will automatically be scheduled for 21 days later. Booster shots will also be available to those already fully vaccinated.

To be vaccinated, individuals under 18 years old must have a parent or guardian present to provide consent. Students who are 18 years or older do not need parental consent. Anyone in a PSD facility is required to wear a face mask, regardless of immunization status. PSD encourages students and staff to be vaccinated; although, it is not a requirement.

Students age 12+ and staff who have completed their primary vaccine series AND are due for a third dose but have not received one will be exempt from quarantining until Feb. 1, 2022. After that date, they will need to be fully up to date with all recommended vaccine doses to be exempt from quarantining. <u>Read more about this Centers for Disease Control and</u> <u>Prevention guidance here. >></u>

These CDPHE mobile clinics are also open to members of the greater community. Because CDPHE's mobile clinic is parked outdoors, no one will need to enter the schools to access it.
