Hello Pirate Families,


This month I'll be circling back to the Approaches to Learning Skills. As a refresher, these skills are grounded in the belief that learning how to learn is fundamental to a student's education. The International Baccalaureate Organization has determined five sets of skills in total: Communication, Social, Self Management, Research, and Thinking. This month I'd like to share more about Communication Skills. Within Communication Skills, there are several sub skills including:

- · Listening-including listening to directions, others, and information
- . Speaking-speaking clearly, giving reports to groups, and expressing ideas
- Reading-reading for a variety of purposes, comprehending what is read, reading fluently and with expression
- · Writing-recording information, taking notes, writing summaries and reports, writing stories
- Viewing- interpreting and analyzing information, understanding how images and language express ideas, values and beliefs
- Presenting- constructing visuals for various audiences and purposes, communicating ideas through various media, the ability to use technology for presentations
- Non-verbal communication-understanding the body language of self and others



## **Music Class Updates**

With the removal of the mask mandates in our schools, it has been wonderful to observe how well our CLPE Pirates treat each other! Those students wearing masks and those not wearing masks have been kind and supportive to one another in the music room! While I continue to wear a mask for personal health reasons, I respect those who choose not to mask, and I have been so happy to see student faces in many situations. We continue to limit our singing to short periods of time, less than 15 minutes total per class, to avoid unnecessary risk and/or quarantines, but we may be able to increase this time as community transmission rates improve. We will be exploring music from various cultures this spring; we have enjoyed exploring music related to Black History Month in February, and we will support exploration of Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month in May.

Please watch for details about logistics in your email and via notes sent home three to four weeks prior to your students' performance dates.

For various reasons, including not having been able to sing for lengthy periods of time, these performances will be brief—less than fifteen minutes in most cases. Only fifth grade will present a longer program, as they will present a Showcase with a few combined songs and then solo or small group acts. We have begun discussing this with fifth graders in music class, and information will be sent home regarding auditions for solo and small group acts. All fifth graders will perform in the full group songs; auditioning to perform solo or in a small group is optional.

#### **Asynchronous Work**

If your student is absent for any reason, but especially if the absence is an extended one, your student will be able to access most of the class activities online. Simply visit Mrs. Flail's Learning Page on the CLPE webpage, click the "Asynchronous Work" heading at the top of the main page, and then click the date for the week music class was missed. This will take you to a Google slide show which can be accessed by anyone signed in with their PSD account. For each slide, there are instructions in the "notes" section below the slide, and there are headings when an activity is targeted to a certain grade level. Of course, some activities cannot be completed outside of class, i.e., playing guitars, singing together, echoing the teacher, etc., but the bulk of the content will be accessible for students wishing to explore it. THIS IS ANOTHER WAY TO ACCESS QUAVER SONGS AND GAMES WE HAVE USED IN CLASS!

#### **Quaver Music-new PSD link**

If you are asked to answer Yes or No, click No. Then you should be at the student dashboard, where your student can explore items like the "Creatives" and other activities.

PLEASE NOTE: DO NOT access Quaver through the Quaver website-it won't work with our special logins/accounts. Be aware that when you "Sign Out" from your Quaver account, you are often automatically sent to the main Quaver page, but that page will not work for your PSD login. You can click the tinyurl link above, or the Quaver button on the home page of Mrs. Flail's Learning Page. You can also bookmark the page when you are logged in! Let me know if you have questions or problems.



To: Parents/Guardians of students enrolled in Colorado schools

From: Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Immunization Branch

RE: Tdap vaccine required at 6-grade entry

January 20, 2022

Dear Parent/Guardian,

In Colorado, students entering 6-grade are required to get the tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis (Tdap) vaccine before they start school. See www.colorado.gov/pacific/cdphe/schoolrequiredvaccines.

Tetanus is a rare, non-contagious disease that can cause painful muscle tightening and stiffness; people can get tetanus through a out or wound. Diphtheria is a rare, contagious disease that can cause breathing problems, heart failure, and other serious issues. Pertussis, or whooping cough, is a very contagious disease that can cause severe coughing spells, difficulty breathing, and other serious issues, especially in infants, toddlers, and other people who have weakened immune systems. Adolescents who get pertussis can be sick for up to three months.

A Tdap dose administered at 10 years of age counts as the adolescent Tdap dose and meets Colorado's 6th grade Tdap requirement: <a href="https://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/hcp/acip-recs/vacc-specific/dtap.html">https://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/hcp/acip-recs/vacc-specific/dtap.html</a>

If your student does not receive Tdap vaccine and does not meet Colorado's 6th grade Tdap requirement, a Certificate of Medical Exemption or an annual Certificate of Nonmedical Exemption must be submitted to the school: <a href="www.colorado.gov/vaccineexemption.">www.colorado.gov/vaccineexemption.</a>. This will assure that your student is in compliance with the Colorado school immunization law and be allowed to attend school.




