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

Each year, students in grades 3-11 take the <u>Colorado Measures of Academic</u> <u>Success</u> standardized tests, which assess how students are meeting Colorado's academic standards in each subject and grade level. This assessment provides valuable information for our school and teachers, who use the data to understand where students are in their learning and tailor instruction accordingly. The district also uses these results to measure overall student academic progress and identify opportunities for improvement. CLPE will begin CMAS testing on April 4th.

- As this school year winds down, we start planning for our next school year. If you are moving out of Poudre School District and your child will not be here next year, please let us know. We will forward permanent records to our records department and they will forward those to your child's new school.
- May 25 is the last day of school and is ½ day. School releases at 11:25am. Breakfast will be served. No lunch service. Buses will drop students off 3 ½ hours earlier than normal.
- Start looking for those lost library books. All library books will be due the beginning of May. This gives everyone plenty of time to check under beds etc....
- As the school year winds down, please remember that any medication left over at the end of the year will need to be picked up by a parent or guardian. We will not send any medication home with a student, prescription or over-the-counter. Medicines that are left at the end of the school year will be disposed of by the school nurse.
- Missing coats or other items? Please be sure to check the lost and found. We will donate lost and found items at the end of the school year.

- Our volunteer system is changing next year. If you are registered volunteer, you may receive an email requesting you to update your information. Next year all volunteers will need to bring a drivers license to sign into the system. Please give us a call if you have any trouble updating your information.
- For next year, if you know your student will need medication at school, authorization forms are available on the PSD website. Go to the Poudre School District website, click on the Parent tab, then to Health Services and scroll down for the appropriate form. <u>New forms must be submitted every year</u>. Any prescription or over-the-counter medicines require an authorization form. As always, these forms are available in the office until the end of this school year and on the CLPE website. Please call 488 -7600 with any questions.
- Student's going into 6th grade will need a **Tdap** immunization. If your child receives this before the end of the school year, bring in the proof of immunization and we will record it in the student information system.

Art

We have been working on a variety of art projects lately:

NEW Covid Protocol

Happy April! This month I'm wrapping up our final Approach to Learning(ATL), social skills. We believe that strong social skills are a vital part of a child's education. Just as with the other ATL's, there are several sub skills within social skills including:

- Accepting responsibility- the ability to take on a task and complete it, sharing responsibility, taking ownership of actions
- **Respecting others** listening to others and making decisions based on fairness, recognizing that others' beliefs and viewpoints may be different, the ability to state opinions without hurting others
- **Cooperating** getting along with others in a group, being courteous, sharing, taking turns
- **Resolving conflict** listening respectfully to others, compromising, reacting reasonably to a situation, being fair
- **Group decision making** listening to and discussing others' ideas, asking questions, the ability to work toward an agreement
- Adopting a variety of group roles- being a leader and a follower, behaving in a way that is appropriate for the situation

District Advisory Board

In the February meeting of the District Advisory Board there were two presentations. The first was from the calendar committee. All parents, staff, and students in 6-12 were provided with the calendar survey in December. This was prompted by many questions about heat mitigation and fall break, and formal input had not been collected in several years. Recommendations are being compiled for the 23-24 school year and will be presented to the school board in April. There was also a presentation by John McKay, the Director of Language, Culture, and Equity. The district is working to identify Principles of Community to identify a set of values or beliefs to support the district mission to Educate Every Child, Every Day. As an organization, we need to be clear in defining the words; value and principle, a list of what constitutes our values and principles, and definitions for each of those words. It was explained that these definitions are critical when, for example, mediating disputes within the schools, that we all have a common definition of terms like "respect." In the March meeting, PSD's Chief Institutional Effectiveness Officer, Dr Dwayne Schmitz presented. There is concern that, compared to similar state districts, PSD is top in reading and math but unfortunately has lower graduation rates. They believe that Connection is an important piece to this puzzle, and that students who feel connected, loved and cared for generally do better in school. The district as a whole has decided to focus on improving connections via literacy interventions. 26 schools: 15 elementary and 11 middle schools, will have a literacy review, some including family focus groups. According to PSD connections survey results, when students are asked the question" what are your hopes and plans for your future?" 93% of students say a parent or guardian plays a part in this answer, and 60% say coaches. This highlights some of the most important connections for our children and is a question we should ask our children periodically throughout their student career. Additionally, PSD families are not taking advantage of college scholarships and federal student aid available to them as much as they could be. The district needs to work on informing students and families of all the resources available to them. To see the PSD connections surveys visit:






