Coordinator Corner

Hi families,

Welcome back ! I hope you had a rejuvenating winter break! This month I'd like to share information with you about another one of the key elements of the primary years program in an IB school, the approaches to learning. If you've been an IB parent for a while, you may have also heard these referred to as, "transdisciplinary skills."

The approaches to learning can essentially be thought of as learning how to learn. This is what the IB has to say about them:

The approaches to learning are grounded in the belief that learning how to learn is fundamental to a student's education. Five categories of interrelated skills aim to support students of all ages to become self-regulated learners who know how to ask good questions, set effective goals and pursue their aspirations with the determination to achieve them. These skills also help to support students' sense of agency, encouraging them to see their learning as an active and dynamic process (IBO 2017).

All teachers foster and support the development of these skills by providing opportunities embedded in authentic learning experiences.

The five categories of skills are:

- Communication skills
- Social skills
- Research skills
- Thinking skills
- Self management skills

Each skill also includes a set of sub skills that are more discrete, observable and measurable.

These skills are also intertwined with the learner profile. For example, this month our learner profile is to practice being **reflective**. Using thinking skills can help us reflect on the process of learning, identify strengths and areas for improvement, as well as consider new skills, techniques and strategies for effective learning.

Here are some questions you might try at home to help your child practice being reflective:

- What did I learn today?
- What don't I understand yet?
- What questions do I have now?
- What can I already do?
- What will I work on next?
- What can I do to become a more effective learner?
- What factors are important for helping me learn well?
- Have I been a principled and balanced thinker? (for example, considering ethical, cultural and environmental implications) (*IBO Approaches to Learning 2020*)



Quaver Music:

Students can access their very own Quaver account with activities, games, and assignments at www.tinyurl.com/2022Quaver. Our district has a special license and website for accessing student accounts through Quaver Music. These accounts are automatically created by our district technology team, and you do not need to create a username or password. Be sure to visit www.tinyurl.com/2022Quaver and sign in using your student's PSD email and password. If you are asked to answer Yes or No, click No. Then you should be at the student dashboard, where your student can explore items like the "Creatives" and other activities. This is a fun way to explore music on your own.


This month, students will be learning about the following art concepts: Kindergarten: Painting on fabric like Faith Ringgold, author of *Tar Beach*
