Happy Spring! Now that March is behind us, we only have 2 months left of school and have much to do! Our CMAS testing begins this month for 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grades. These tests assess how students are meeting Colorado's academic standards in each subject and grade level. This assessment provides valuable information for our school and teachers, who use the data to understand where students are in their learning and tailor instruction accordingly. The district also uses these results to measure overall student academic progress and identify opportunities for improvement. You can help us make this a successful experience for your child by insuring they get a good night's sleep, a healthy breakfast and arrive to school on time. Many tests will begin soon after the school bell rings (7:50). Once the testing begins, students will not be allowed into their classroom. Please do everything you can to get your child to school on time and if possible, schedule appointments outside the testing windows. The testing schedule is listed below.



Hi Families,

I hope you and your families are enjoying the longer days and the gradual shift to warmer weather. This month I'd like to continue sharing another key element of the IB program; taking action.



Taking action is an essential part of student agency in the IB program and is a key component throughout all levels of an IB education. Students may take action in response to their inquiries, linking their learning to community and global issues and opportunities. Action may also arise spontaneously in response to a need that has been seen.

"Action, the core of student agency, is integral to the Primary Years Programme (PYP) learning process and to the programme's overarching outcome of international-mindedness. Through taking individual and collective action, students come to understand the responsibilities associated with being internationally minded and to appreciate the benefits of working with others for a shared purpose. When students see tangible actions that they can choose to take to make a difference, they see themselves as competent, capable and active agents of change." The International Baccalaureate Organization (Oxfam 2015)

Initiated by students, PYP action is authentic, meaningful, mindful, responsible and responsive. Action could be:

- a change in attitude
- a plan for the future
- a demonstration of respect or responsibility
- leading or joining a school/community organization
- engaging in local decision-making
- a conscious choice not to act
- an adjustment in behavior

#### Connecting action and the learner profile

Through developing attributes of the learner profile, students grow in their ability to make informed, reasoned, ethical judgments and to exercise the flexibility, perseverance and confidence they need to bring about positive change in the learning community and beyond.

For example, let's say students are investigating the Central Idea: Humans make choices that have an impact on the environment.

Students synthesize and apply their conceptual understandings, knowledge and approaches to learning to take action on issues—knowledgeable:

Students may identify the problem of air quality on the road adjacent to their school as something for which they propose possible solutions.

Actions might include:

- lifestyle choices—walking-to-school days, "switching off engine" campaigns for stationary cars
- advocacy— seeking local press support in publicizing a tree-planting scheme to help compensate for air pollution

Oftentimes we think of action as something requiring a major change or having a wide reaching influence on others. In truth it is more often the small personal actions that have the greatest impact and ripple effect. I encourage you to talk with your children about ways that they might make a change based on their learning and observations.

Here are those community skills if you would like to practice them at home with your children!

#### **Following Directions**

- 1. Look at the Person
- 2. Say okay
- 3. Do it right away

#### **Getting Someone's Attention**

- 1. Wait until the other person is finished speaking or available
- 2. Look at the person
- 3. Say "excuse me"
- 4. Wait until he or she acknowledges you.
- 5. Say what you want

#### **Talking with others**

- 1. Look at the person
- 2. Use a pleasant voice
- 3. Ask questions
- 4. Avoid Interrupting
